This term Year 5 have been looking at sketches by LS Lowry, focusing mainly on his most famous drawings “Going to Work” and “Going to the Match”.

Year 5 have learnt about his life and looked in detail at his style that became synonymous with his name. His dull colour pallet creates very atmospheric drawings which the children were able to describe and associate it with emotive brilliant language.

They had a go creating their very own versions of Lowry’s work by drawing a local landmark in his style. Using pencils and oil pastels they created a representation of the local Monkwearmouth’s Station Museum. Lowry was very famous for the figures he put into his art and these became referred to as “matchstick men”. The children put their own matchstick figures into their beautiful drawings.
